He is being treated for injuries at Animals Unlimited Veterinary Clinic. "The Humane Society would like to thank the good Samaritan who stopped to help the husky off the road and Deputy Anthony Perdue of the Jackson County Sheriff's Office for keeping the dog safe until a volunteer from our organization could get to this poor boy," said Lisa Abele.
